

ANNUAL TUITION (Standard)

Tuition includes the cost of most local field trips, retreats, outdoor education fees, laboratory and other science fees, tickets to school productions, a yearbook, student photographs and I.D. cards. It also covers workbooks, classroom materials, and textbooks.

OTHER FEES and SERVICES (as applicable)

1. An **International Baccalaureate service and examination fee** is charged for twelfth grade students. The examination fees are set by the IB Office in Geneva and vary according to a student's program. The current average cost is \$1,250 (due December 15, 2017).
2. A **Capital Levy** of \$2,500 is assessed for each newly enrolled student to defray costs from regularly-scheduled capital improvements and upgrades to existing facilities (due July 1, 2017).
3. **Bring Your Own Device:** iPads are required for students in grades 6 through 10 for use during the school day and at home. Technical specifications change from year to year, but for the 2017-2018 school year the minimum suggested specifications for those purchasing new devices are iPad Mini 4 and iPad Air 2. Grade 11 and 12 students are required to bring a device to school every day, as well, but the device can be any Internet-enabled device with general productivity tools. Students receiving financial aid in grades 6-12 who would like assistance in purchasing an iPad should contact the Financial Aid Office.
4. **Independent Language Study:** Some Upper School students and, occasionally, Middle School students, study languages not regularly taught at WIS on a tutorial basis. This language study can be part of a student's IB or pre-IB course of study and may be either that student's native language or a foreign language. In order for this language study to be recognized as a school course, arrangements must be approved by the School. WIS will be happy to assist with these arrangements. Fees for outside language study will be set by the outside tutor and will normally be paid directly to the tutor.
5. **Optional extra trips and special events** are not covered by tuition. These include but are not limited to: camping and long distance class trips, ski trips, and optional plays, performances and special events. Costs vary depending on the nature of the event and/or the length of the trip (due prior to the event). Aid for some academically related events may be available for students who receive tuition aid. Check with the Financial Aid Office.
6. A **shuttle bus**, operated by the School, runs between the Tregaron and Primary School campuses. Enrollment in this program is \$950 for both round-trip and one-way usage per year (due November 11, 2017). For service on a per-trip basis the charge is \$10 (due as billed). Billing by the term (\$370 – Primary School) and the semester (\$555 – Middle and Upper Schools) is also available, as is drop-in use, space permitting.

7. **Primary School Early Arrival and Extended Day Care:** Registration is done by term only (payment due as billed) to coincide with the After School Class enrollment schedule. (Terms are August–December, January to Spring Break, and April-June.) Rates listed assume daily attendance, but fees can be prorated for regular attendance of fewer than five days per week. **Rates cannot, however, be prorated on less than a per term basis.** The Drop-in Fee for Early Arrival is \$45 per day and for Extended Day Care is \$45 per day. Students who are not enrolled in an Auxiliary Program or involved in a school-sponsored activity, but who are still on campus after the end of school, will be enrolled in Extended Day Care and billed the daily drop-in rate. Late pick-up after 6:00 PM will incur a fee of \$30 per quarter of an hour, or fraction thereof. Information about After School Classes is emailed to parents before each term. 8. **Middle School After School Supervision:** Registration can be annual (payment due November 15, 2017) or by semester. Rates listed assume daily attendance, but fees can be prorated for regular attendance of fewer than five days per week. **Rates cannot, however, be prorated on less than a per semester basis.** The Drop-in Fee is \$30 per day. Students who are on campus after the end of school or more than 15 minutes after the end of a school-sponsored activity will be enrolled in After School Supervision at the daily drop-in rate. Late pick-up after 6:00 PM will incur a fee of \$30 per quarter of an hour, or fraction thereof. 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9. **Vacation Camps** are typically held during the winter and spring breaks for Primary School children. The fee is approximately \$405 per week. Attendance can also be by the day, for a prorated fee (due as billed).

10. **Incidental expenses** include but are not limited to such items as replacement of lost library books and tutoring recommended or deemed necessary (due as billed).

11. The **Washington International School Parent Association** charges a voluntary fee of \$45. This fee appears on the initial bill sent to each family. To decline this fee, send an email to the Student Accounts Office (saini@wis.edu) by October 31, 2017.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

The full terms and conditions of payment are stated on the enrollment contract. When submitting a contract, parents/guardians choose one of the following payment options.

- **One payment** – 100% of tuition, minus enrollment deposit, is **due July 1, 2017**. There is a 1% tuition discount if full payment is received on or before July 1, 2017. There is no discount on other fees. Financial aid students do not receive the 1% discount.
- **Two payments** – 60% of tuition, minus enrollment deposit, is **due July 1, 2017**. **The balance is due December 1, 2017.**
- **Ten monthly payments** – 10% of tuition and fees is due monthly **May 15, 2017 through February 15, 2018**. The enrollment deposit is credited toward the first installment. *A processing surcharge of \$200 is due with the first installment.*

Tuition payments can be made by check drawn on a US bank, money order, wire transfer, direct debit and credit card (MasterCard and Visa). Contact the Student Accounts Office to arrange direct debit. **Payments are due no later than the 1st of the month for those enrolled in the one-payment plan and two-payment plan, and the 15th of the month for those enrolled in the 10-payment plan.**
