Below are some terms and abbreviations used to describe financial aid programs that might be unfamiliar to those applying for aid for the first time.

| Estimated Family | The amount SSS (see below) estimates a family might be able to pay <br> for educational costs. WIS, like all schools, uses this as a guideline. A <br> number of families receiving aid have a suggested family <br> contribution of \$0 but pay at least \$100 per month. All families, <br> therefore, are asked to pay more than the suggested amount. |

| Need-based Aid | Financial aid based on the need of individual families. All financial <br> aid awarded by WIS is need based. Aid is available for children in <br> Kindergarten through Grade 12. |
| PFS | Parents' Financial Statement - the form parents complete to <br> document their income, assets, and liabilities, as well as their |
| specific family situations such as number of children and expenses |  |
| over and above the usual costs for housing, food, clothing, and other |  |
| daily expenses. |  |
